

  - Mailing address: lots of mail, « new publics »
  - Use statistic: 80%+ users from search engines
  - R and D: Improvements to integrate in main catalogues and archives

### The problem with access to library collections:


People aren't using the library catalog?

The *real* problem is that we don't expose our collections very well on the web.


