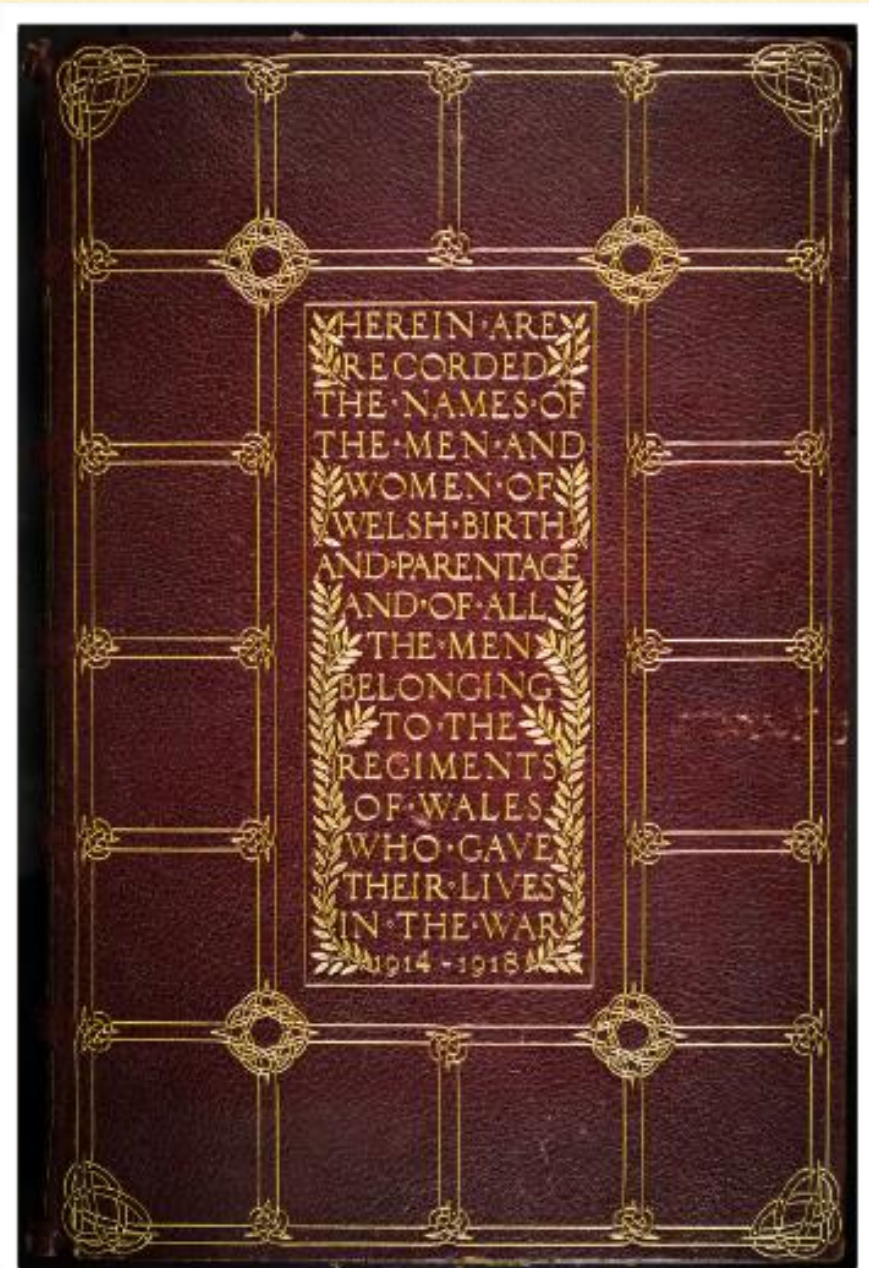

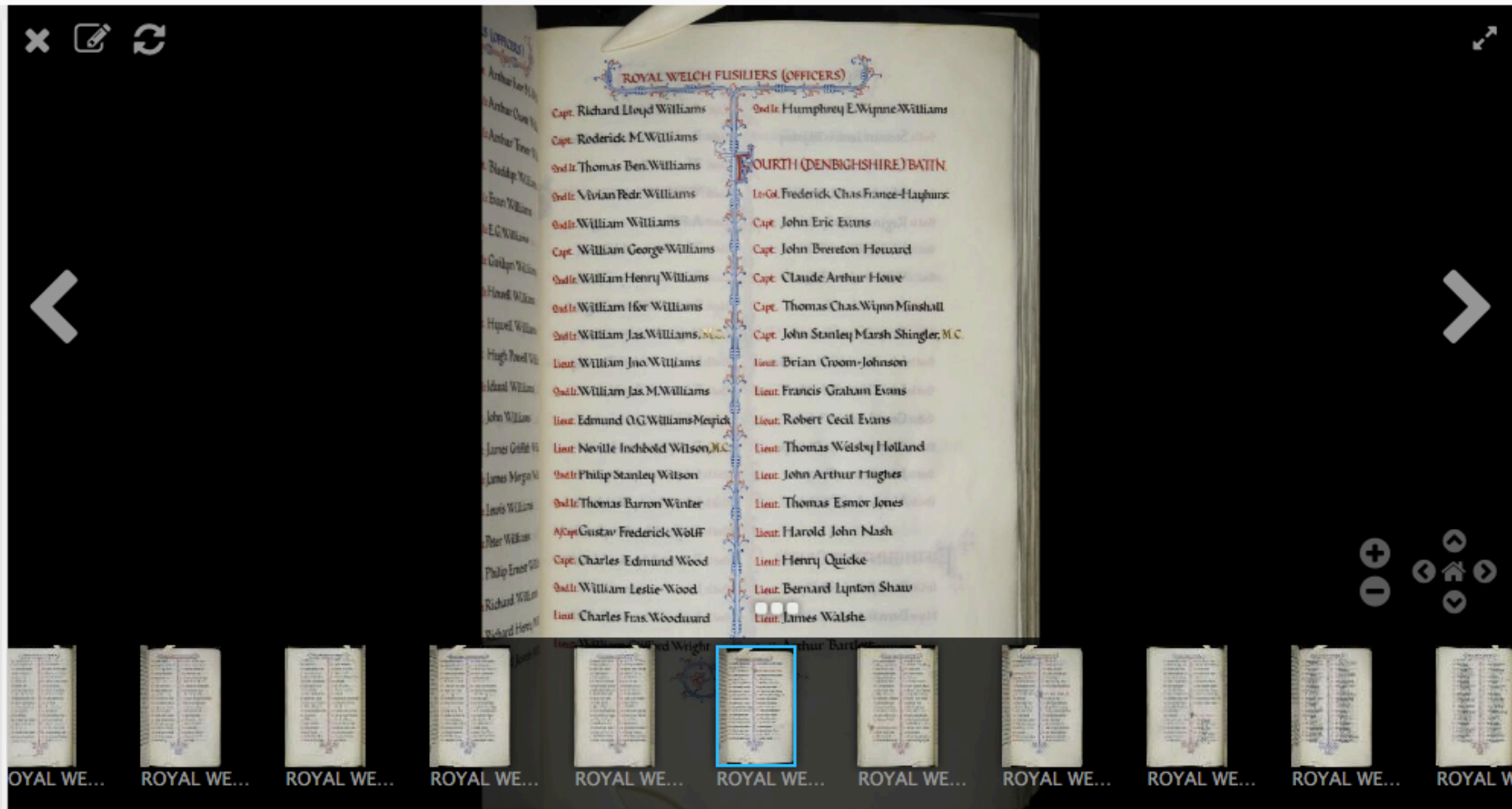


- Developed for the Welsh Book of Remembrance project

WILLIAM JONES, Esq. in the Chair.
A letter having been read from Major-General Gascoyne approving the idea of providing four light FIELD-PIECES for the DEFENCE of the HARBOUR and COAST, (as recommended by a Meeting held here the 26th ult.) and advising it to be carried into immediate effect.
This Meeting seeing the necessity of immediate and active exertion, do enter into the following resolutions.
1. That they will, at their own expense, purchase FOUR BRASS SIX POUNDERS, with their Carriages and proper appendages, to be placed upon the Hills commanding the Harbour of Swansea and adjacent Coast; and to be under the care and direction of the Commander of the Sea Fencibles, and exercised by a sufficient number of his best Gunners.
2. That the Most Noble the Lord Lieutenant of the County be requested to apply to the Secretary of War for permission to carry the above Resolution into effect, and to request that proper ammunition be issued for the service of such guns.
3. That the following Gentlemen be requested to form a Committee for carrying the above Resolutions into effect, and for soliciting the assistance of the Copper-works, Collieries, and respectable Inhabitants of this Town; and that any three of them be sufficient to act; viz. Wm. Jones, Dr. Wm. Turton, Charles Nevill, John Jones, Wm. Grove, and George Haynes.
4. That Mr. CHARLES NEVILL be appointed Treasurer.

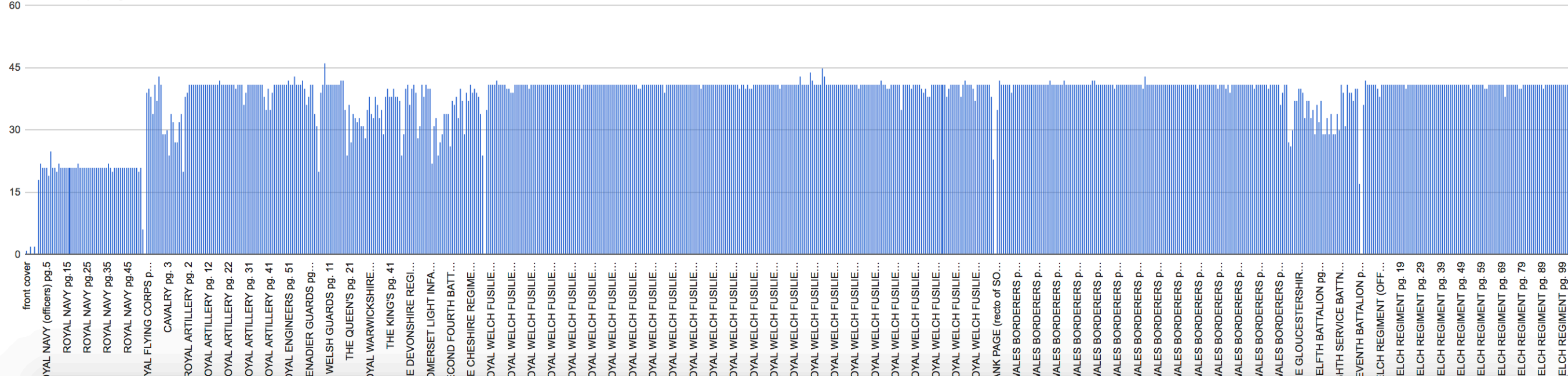
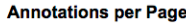

Percentage pages with annotations



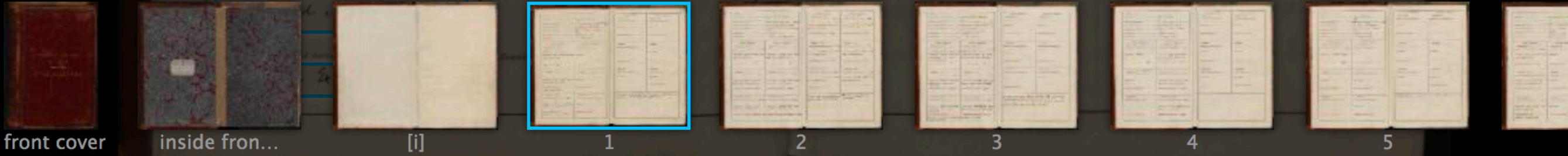
Below is a graph showing the number of annotations per page.
